Finance Report – for the month of November 2022

Another quiet month.

On the income side, we collected £325 from members towards the cost of the H&S championship dinner and transport which covered all the associated cost. We collected £105 for room hire and other £40 of coaching levy from the junior squad.


On the expenditure side, the major costs were £598 for the site management fee, £601 for the RIB service, £390 in coaching costs, £408 for the RIB grab bags and £194 on the new bollard keys. Other costs related to parts for boat maintenance and the usual fuel costs for the minibus and RIBs.

Although the crossed meter issue has purportedly been resolved, we have not yet received an invoice from Utility Warehouse for the electricity consumption over the past few months. I have been advised it will take a few weeks for that to come through. Meanwhile I am continuing to accrue for the cost.

We closed the month with an available cash balance of £5.1k (after reserving cumulatively £1.4k for electricity).



27th November 2022

Racing Update

November whilst being a month of wind and rain has been a quieter month on the racing front with the Colin Fagan Head cancelled due to poor weather. The club, however, did have crews racing on the 19th November at Avon Head and 20th The Vets 4 Head.

We took two crews to Avon Autumn Head on the 19th November, the Ladies 8 and a J15 Boys coxed quad. Whilst the weather was beautiful (for once) the day got off to a slightly worrying start with he discovery that we had left one of the riggers for the 8 in the other trailer. However, the combined charm of Livvy and Sophie managed to secure a trusty Janousek 8 from Avon County. With a rapid stream, Livvy at stroke kept it sharp and the crew spinning, along resulting in them posting a very decent time winning Band 2 8s by 18 seconds and coming 5th overall only being beaten by Bath and Bristol University Crews. The boys quad came in a highly creditable fifth.

The next day Tim and Kenny set off with Pete and Ray from Poole to do the Vets 4s Head in London. It is clear that Masters rowing is getting more and more professional with competition fierce at the big London events. Despite this the Lymington/Poole had an excellent row fighting with a faster Grosvenor crew all the way down the course and coming in a highly impressive 4th out of 11 in Masters E 4-.

Looking forward the club has entries in one more event before Christmas, Walton Small Boats Head on 11th December. With Burway Small Boats Head cancelled yesterday and red boards on the Thames at the moment we are crossing our fingers that it will go ahead.


On the 11th December we will be running the 2nd Annual Christmas Pudding race in the lagoon and will be hoping to get as many of the club as possible competing in this scratch event of mixed crews of all ages.

Our other focus at the moment is trying to ensure that there is coaching and structure in place for the potential crews to compete in the Hants and Dorset ARA regattas in the summer of 2023.

Equipment Update

It has been a relatively quiet time in terms of equipment with the focus now on maintenance for the junior boats and personally I believe we need to look to get the Skylarc refurbished – I note that Janousek had flagged to Pete that they are very busy at the moment.

Also we will continue to try and sell on kit that we are not using - my proposal below is we look to sell the 2nd eight.



Decisions Required

The following decisions are required.

- Agreement to purchase Marc Tremain's ergo for £650 and then we will sell one of the older ones.
- Approval to sell the Reliant Sims eight we will need to tidy it up.

Club Structure

As you will be aware one of the things that I am very keen to continue to progress is a sustainable long term structure. It is increasingly clear if we are to do this we need to also find ways in which to increase club income outside membership income to support the continued refresh of the fleet (rather than expand given storage space is maxed out) and development of a coaching infrastructure for the club.

From a personal perspective I think we should set ourselves a target that maybe up to 50% of revenues should come from non-membership income on a 3 year view with other potential sources being;

- Sponsorship Revenues
- Association with Schools and Grants
- Summer Camps Targeted mainly at Juniors and mainly non-members which would be delivered by Rowing Adventures for the club with support from Junior member mentors
- Visits from other clubs Coastal Rowing is growing in popularity and we are in a prime position to leverage this.

In terms of Sponsorship my proposal is that we look to advertise in the club for 2-3 people not on the committee to work with Fee and myself to develop a sponsorship proposition which we would then bring back to the committee for agreement.

In terms of the other 3 items I believe that we can facilitate them with support from Rowing Adventures (i.e. Kirsty) as well as working in partnership with schools or other clubs (e.g. Lymington Town Sailing Club). In the case of the latter, Fee and I had an initial meeting with Tony Evans from Lymington Town Sailing Club and there were 2 areas which seemed particularly of mutual interest – looking at putting a VersaDock/equivalent on the left hand side of the pontoon and collaborating on Summer Camps.

We are currently awaiting a proposal from Tony (who has also had very positive support from the harbourmaster) on the Versadock. We will discuss this further at the Committee since we recognise we need to balance our neighbours as well as ensure any activity does not clash with club rowing activity.

Other Topics

There are number of parents who want to get involved in supporting but are worried about the insurance and training element. As a club we need to ensure 1) They are properly DBS checked and 2) That they are insured to support – I would appreciate a discussion on this at the committee.
