





Finance Report – for the month of October 2022

October has been a quiet month on the finance front.

On the income side, we collected £365 in coaching levy from the junior squad. Other receipts were £137 of membership fees and a further £144 on entry fees outstanding from the 2022 season.


On the expenditure side, we spent £267 on new boat shoes and had to spend £512 on repairs to the steering system on the RIB. We paid out £640 for the Hants & Dorset Championship dinner of which we were reimbursed £440 from members during October and the balance should be received in November.

We have made some progress on the crossed electricity meter issue and our supply is in the process of being transferred back to Utility Warehouse and the old tariff.

We closed the month with an available cash balance of £7.5k (after reserving cumulatively £1,200 for electricity).



### Racing Update

October has been a quieter month in terms of racing as the squads started to get into the new season.

October started with a brace of strong results at the Pairs Head where Pete/Dave won the Masters C 2- and Kenny came  $2^{nd}$  in the Masters E 2x.

Next on the list was Reading Small Boats Head on 8<sup>th</sup> October 2022 where Alex was our sole representative coming in 1<sup>st</sup> in Intermediate Sculls.

Our scullers also attended Weybridge Silver Sculls on XX Oct putting in creditable performances with Alex came in 5<sup>th</sup> in Senior Band 2 Sculls and Ellie 7<sup>th</sup> in the Senior Band 2 Ladies Sculls.

October was rounded off by a strong club attendance on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2022 at Upper Thames Autumn Head where a combination of the men, ladies and Juniors put in an encouraging performance for the 1<sup>st</sup> race of the season – the results were as follows

- 1<sup>st</sup> Masters E 2x Tim/Kenny who continued their strong run of form well done to them
- 3rd Women's 8, Girls J15 2x, Boys J16 4+, Boys J15 4x+,
- 4th Open 2x and Boys J16 2x
- 6<sup>th</sup> Open 4x a very creditable performance against some strong competition.

As we look forward into this month, we are hoping to run the Colin Fagan Head on Sunday where we have a number of entries particularly from the Juniors, Avon Head for the Ladies. On top of this we are continuing to see a solid turnout from men and Juniors for land training with the former now incorporating a weights circuit for the 1<sup>st</sup> time since I have been a member of the club!


The focus at the moment is trying to continue to work on a structure to support the development of our most promising athletes – I still continue to feel we have some way to go on this.
