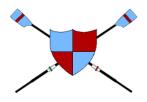

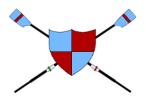

Finance Report – the report for the month of March 2023 was circulated in advance and is set out below.

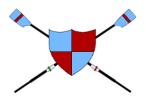
Safety Report – there were no matters to report.

Finance Report – for the month of March 2023

We received a further £3,696 in membership renewals this month, taking our income from membership renewals for 2023 to under £18.8k. We received a further £900 for pontoon membership renewals taking the total for 2023 to £1.8k. We have 5 pontoon licenses remaining in hand and expect these to be taken up once the season starts as in prior years.

On the expenditure side, we had a few major items: £2,250 on the refurb on Skylark; £654 being the first half of the management fee for 2023; £445 British Rowing Affiliation; and £350 on Stan's retirement gift.

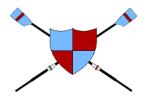
The only additional cost incurred this month for MoS regatta was £65 for the addition of an extra baseto one of the trophies. A separate P&L for the 2023 is included at the back of this report.

The formal complaint with Utility Warehouse has finally got some traction and I am expecting an up to date bill in April for all the time to March 2023. We have been offered £25 in compensation for the hassle. I will be asking for more!

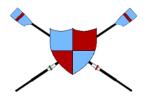
We closed the month with an available cash balance in our current account of £16.1k (after reserving cumulatively £2.2k for electricity). The Dave Stafford account still has a balance of £3.7k which we plan to use the £3k of Love Rowing grant to fund coaching costs for the next season.
