

# January 2022 Committee Meeting Held at LARC





#### **Reports**

#### Captain's Report - Hugo

The Captain's Report was circulated in advance of the meeting and is attached below.

Hugo mentioned the recent racing and also the success of the Xmas Pudding event.

He thanked Pete for all his work on the second 8+ which is hoped to be ready for use by the end of next week. This will be transformation giving us the ability to have a boat suited for the men's, women's and development squads.

Noted that Trafalgar has been sold to Tideway Scullers for £1,200 and some that the PM5 monitors are gradually being updated on the ergos. The red ergo has been sold and Terry is organising collection.

Janousek have given a quote of £780 for a respray of one of the singles. It was agreed to do This Way Up rather than Bruce as the work on Bruce is largely superficial. This Way Up also needs a repair to the bulk head in the bow which is expected to cost a further £300 approx.

On the coaching side, Hugo mentioned that Jane has indicated she will have to step back from junior coaching after Easter. We need to revisit the question of finding a paid coach for the club, probably for 12-18 hours a week. Hugo will work up a proposal for Committee consideration for the February meeting with input from Pete, Fee and Waddy on the legal side.

#### Treasurer's Report - Fee

The Financial Report was circulated in advance of the meeting and is attached below.

Fee reported a quiet month on the finance front.


Stan asked about the line item "Costs of social events" – this is made up of £50 deposit for the forthcoming Italian night plus £384 for the costs of the Costco shop for the December event. It was noted that the cost of utilities is low because we had been overpaying in the past and had credit to offset.

It was noted that all the bar costs and income are outside the Lloyds account and Fee agreed to speak to Mike about how we best get visibility on this.

Fee noted that she still needs to agree the recharge for the pontoon electric.

#### Safety Report - Jane

There were no Rowing Club incidents to report. But Kirsty reported that she had a client who presented with a heart issues during a Rowing Adventures land training session and had to call an



ambulance. She noted that we don't have any provisions here and it was agreed we should ask Jane to draw up a proposal of what we might want to have on hand, including the possibility of a defibrillator.

Also discussed the possibility of a water focused first aid course and Kirtsy agreed to investigate whether we could access the Royal Lymigton SC first aid training either at club or individual level.

Finally noted that with the decline in weather conditions we need to ensure members, especially juniors, are only on the water when suitably dressed.



#### **January Committee Meeting 2021**

#### Captain's Report

December saw the club competing at 2 heads, BRIC and also hosting our inaugural Christmas Pudding races which was a great event.

On the 5<sup>th</sup> December we took some of the Juniors to Hampton Junior Small Boat Head. Whilst our crew line up was impacted by COVID with Pippa, Annabelle and George R having to scratch, those who attended had a great event in what for some was their 1<sup>st</sup> river race. The times as you would expect were very competitive from a LARC perspective

- Seb and Callan competed very credibly in their first Doubles racing finishing 8<sup>th</sup> out of 15 in J17 2x.
- - In the single sculls, Seb came 21<sup>sst</sup> out of 34 in the J17 sculls narrowly being pipped in time by Callan who came 13<sup>th</sup> out of 39 in the J16 sculls with Angus 33<sup>rd</sup> (in his 1<sup>st</sup> ever race)
- Maisie and Crista were 17<sup>th</sup> out of 18 in the J18 2x.

On the same day we also had a number of the J16 squad and below competing in BRIC indoor ergo competition which was run virtually from the club.


- In J16 Girls (Yr 11) Imogen Scott in her first competition finished an impressive 5<sup>th</sup> in her 1<sup>st</sup> race narrowly missing out on 4<sup>th</sup>.
- In J15 Boys (Yr 10) Sol Chamberlain came an impressive 12<sup>th</sup> (out of 23), George Balfour 15<sup>th</sup>, Patrick McCabe 19<sup>th</sup>
- In J14 Boys (Yr 9) Tom Bellion was 29<sup>th</sup>.

On 12<sup>th</sup> December – HM and Pete Lock raced Walton Head in a pair, recording the fastest Master's time by 15 seconds, winning Masters C but narrowly losing out (2 seconds) on the combined category Masters D which involved us giving up 17 seconds.

Finally we wrapped up the pre-Christmas racing with a memorable morning which saw 12 scratch fours competing in our inaugural club Christmas Pudding race. The course was c.500m at the top of the lagoon which included a buoy turn as well. For some of the youngsters it was the first time they had raced with an oar (vs. sculls) as well as mastering the buoy turn. The racing was tight with all crews being within a couple of lengths and the final being won by a canvas by Kirsty, Alex, Lukasz and Izzy coxed by Tim from Jane, Lena, George and Crista coxed by Livvy.

In the 500m ergo sprint Waddy maintained his reputation as the club strongman. The crews were fueled by Bacon sandwiches and the event ended with some Christmas Carols led by our President Brian.

Our focus on the short term is getting the 8s rolling with the club hoping to have both 8s afloat in the next 2 weeks with a particular thanks to Pete for all of his hard work on the 2<sup>nd</sup>



8. Crews are entered at Henley 4s and 8s Head on 12<sup>th</sup> February and will also be doing the Head of the Stour before heading for WEHORR and the Vets Heads on the Tideway in March. An outline schedule of potential races for the 2022 season is included in the Appendix below.

Planning is also underway for Lymington Offshore and Milford Regatta on 14<sup>th</sup> May 2022.

#### **Equipment Update**

We have sold the Trafalgar to Tideway Scullers raising c.£1.2k and Pete has been busy finishing the fit out of the 2<sup>nd</sup> 8 with Neaves scheduled to produce the footstretchers. The Frank is now inside to be refitted.

We will be getting the Eton down shortly so that the J16 boys are able to race Henley 4s and 8s before reverting to the Skylarc for the coastal heads.

We have also bought a new Cox box as approved at the previous meeting and added a couple of more PM5 screens so we now have 8 ergos with PM5s.

We have had a quote on repairing This Way Up from Janousek for £780.

- Approval to proceed with the refit of This Way Up.


#### **Coaching Update**

This remains a priority in my eyes if we are able to have a sustainable club we need to get this up and running. The primary focus would be on getting a Junior coach since this at present is c.30 people and to my mind needs to stay at this number if membership numbers are to stay at the current level. A secondary focus would be to focus where required on a Saturday morning adult crews.

It would be for a maximum of 20 hours per week and would cover 2x Sat and Sun 5 hours (morning) and then Mon Evening, 2 hours, Weds c.4 hours.


From my perspective, I would welcome input from the committee but personally I think we need to start putting a fund aside to support the recruitment of a coach but also we would need to cover off by a potential levy on Juniors and increased Junior membership.

This is becoming increasingly important since neither Jane nor I can continue to put the amount of time we have been putting into Juniors on a 6-12 month view.

#### **Finance Report December 2021**

The major receipt in December was for the sale of the river4+ which was sold for £1,200 to Tideway Scullers. We had our first receipts for room hire for Emma's regular pilates sessions. Kirsty's indoor sessions for November and December were invoiced in January. These will be both invoiced on a monthly basis going forwards.

As agreed at the December Committee meeting we invested £654 in a new cox box for the eight. A total of £664 was paid for sundry equipment and maintenance (pallets to replace broken trolleys, rigger parts and ergo monitors). The other major expenditure this month was on bus insurance, the annual renewal costing £783.
