




#### **Reports**



#### Finance Report – for the month of September 2022


A light month on the membership side with just a couple of new half year memberships. However, the exercise to collect outstanding regatta fees is well underway and we collected over £600 this month. The exercise will be completed next month now that the final H&D regatta and SCC are behind us. We also received a refund of £282 entry fees from Poole for the cancelled regatta.

On the expenditure side, we purchased a new set of weights for £1,200 as approved at the September meeting. We incurred costs of £360 for the hire of a skip for the club clean up and had a further £570 in coaching costs for the September sessions.


We closed the month with an available cash balance of £8.1k (after reserving cumulatively £1,000 for electricity). This is after investments in rowing assets in the 12 months to 30 Sept 2022 of £24k.



#### **Captain's Report**

## **Committee Meeting October 2022**

September saw Lymington finish the Coastal season in style with a strong performance in the Open Regatta at the South Coast Championships in Paignton and the Juniors have a fantastic day at Itchen Junior Regatta.

The South Coast Championships at Paignton were a well run event with decent weather although a cross-chop did develop in the afternoon. We took a total of 5 crews down to Paignton to compete in the Open Regatta and emerged with 3 wins, 1 2<sup>nd</sup> (very close) and a 3<sup>rd</sup> resulting in us winning the Open Regatta Victor Ludorum which we look forward to receiving at the Hants and Dorset dinner.

The same weekend Tim Bull and Kenny Chalk competed at the World Masters Championships in France putting in some strong performances in the their 1x, 2x and also a four with Poole (see Appendix for details).

A week later it was the Junior Squad's turn with us taking a number of crews J15 downwards to Itchen Junior Regatta on the following weekend on 17<sup>th</sup> September. We took a big squad with the plan to give as many of them racing experience as possible, some of whom had only started sculling over the summer. The day was a massive success with 5 wins and the camaraderie amongst the kids amazing with the parents stepping up to help.


On the same day we also took four scullers to the Scullers Head in London where Alex, Seb, Ellie and Pippa bravely took on the Boat Race course in reverse

Most recently on 2<sup>nd</sup> October the club had 2 crews competing at the Pairs Head. Pete Lock and Dave Mans put in a strong performance racing the City of Oxford crew all the way down the course and eventually beating them by 0.4 Seconds! Tim Bull and Kenny Chalk also had a great result coming in 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Masters E2x, congratulations to them all.

The same weekend Kirsty Melin and Julia Fabrizzi also competed in the offshore race at Exmouth coming in 2<sup>nd</sup> in the M50 over the 6km course. This was a good warm up for this coming weekend where they are competing at the World Rowing Coastal Championships at Saundersfoot.

So in summary, the club has seen some excellent results in a busy month's racing and we are hoping that we can take this momentum into the autumn head seasons with crews from all squads racing and Upper Thames Head on 30<sup>th</sup> October 2022.

On the social front it was great to see so many of the club young and old at the club social on 23<sup>rd</sup> September with great food once again from Jo and Guy Verney.



#### Squads update

It is encouraging to see as we begin to ramp up the squads for next season that there is some real positive momentum particularly in the Ladies and Juniors where with 35 members we have had to split it into 2 squads – Junior Race Squad (currently 12 but it will expand) with the rest in the Junior Development Squad. As the ability of people in the latter improves the expectation is they will move to the race squad.

It is really encouraging to note the engagement of the parents who are stepping up to help with the admin (each squad has one) and parents are also contributing to running sessions with Hugo and Kirsty away.

Despite this we have had to introduce a coaching levy (£25 for all Junior quad members and £15 for the second child) to pay the coaches to support the Junior Development sessions. This will reduce the coaching cost to the club (we hope this should cover at least 60% of the cost of the sessions between October and December 2022. We are hopeful with our new fee structure for 2023 that this will help cover much of the coaching costs going forward.

The ladies squad with incoming captain Sophie driving has started really positively and we are planning to race the eight at Upper Thames Head. The Men under Pete's guidance are also slowly beginning to ramp up their training.

#### **Equipment Update**

It has been a relatively quiet time in terms of equipment with the only expenditure £1.2k on some new weights which will support the Men's and Women's training on a Tuesday evening.


The focus now is on maintenance for the junior boats and personally I believe we need to look to get the Skylarc refurbished as soon as we have the funds to do so and if the Janousek quote is reasonable.

#### **Decisions Required**


The following decisions are required.
